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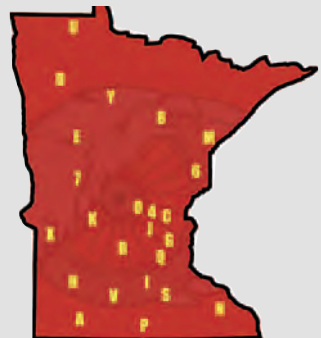
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Dear Fellow Motorcyclists:

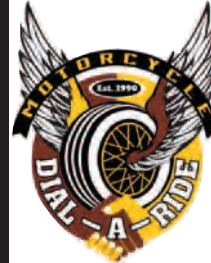

DIAL-A-RIDE

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The number of motorcyclists who have died in traffic accidents so far this year is significantly higher than last year, 26 riders compared to 16 last year, according to the Minnesota Department of Public Safety. That is a 56 percent increase. It is also the highest number for this period since the state began keeping records. That compares to only 46 motorcycle fatalities all of last year.

"Motorcyclists and motorists need to work together to share the road to prevent more motorcycle fatalities," says Lt. Bob Zak, Minnesota State Patrol.

According to the DPS, 14 of the riders who were killed were not wearing helmets at the time, and 17 of the fatal accidents occurred in rural areas.

Many of the fatal accidents were caused, at least in part, by driver errors. The agency said riders in 11 of the accidents failed to negotiate a curve. Three others were caused by a second vehicle failing to yield. The DPS is urging riders to take motorcycle safety classes; protect themselves by wearing helmets, protective and reflective clothing; and not drinking and driving. Minnesota Motorcycle Safety Center (MMSC) Program Coordinator Bill Shaffer says training courses, even for experienced riders, are always a good idea. "Training can save a rider's life," said Shaffer. "It teaches riders crash-avoidance techniques to stay safe on the road. You can never get too much training as a new rider, returning rider or experienced rider."

EDUCATION

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I will start with an update with how we, as an organization, are educating ourselves. I reached out to each chapter to get a feel for what rider training has occurred since we are about halfway through the rider training season.

So far, Lake Chapter has hosted an IRC with eight participants and an ARC with seven participants. Mostly chapter funds were used, but \$300 was reimbursed by Southwest District Rider Training (DRT) funds.

Glacial Ridge Chapter contracted an IRC that had three participants, using funds from the Tri-County membership challenge. They also contracted a BRC paid for out of personal pockets, with the exception of one participant who was reimbursed \$300 from Southwest DRT funds.

Heart of the Lakes Chapter contracted an IRC with eight participants using chapter funds. Tri-County Chapter contracted an IRC with ten participants using partial chapter funds. Way West Chapter hosted a Road Guard Course that had ten participants using chapter funds.

Between chapter and state general funds, A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota has spent \$2,300 on training 47 motorcyclists so far this season. That averages out to \$49 per rider. Keep in mind that these numbers are approximate and will be solidified at the end of the training season. As far as DRT funds are concerned, only the Southwest District has used the \$600 budgeted for them by the state. The other three districts still have \$600 each, available to use for rider training this year. To clear up confusion, Road Guard Course ARE eligible to be funded by DRT funds.

On to the Young Riders Scholarship update. To remind everyone, the scholarship program can only use gambling funds and is completely separate from the A.B.A.T.E. of MN Young

Riders. I have been tracking activity to the best ability. When we shut the scholarship down in early April, we had spent approximately \$25,500 on 98 students. Some classes are canceled by the colleges and the student re-registers for a different date. Some students decide to back out and actually have the respect to reach out and ask me to cancel them in time for us to get our money back. As it currently stands, 94 students have been paid for at a cost of \$24,605.

As I have reported before, we received more attendance information from the college system last year than we were supposed to. I am unable to give you a play by play and will have to wait until the training season is over and get an overall percentage of students, we spent money on that attended their rider training courses. I will be able to give our membership a geographical breakdown of where the money was spent, but I will not be able to decipher if the student in that area actually attended or was a no-show.

We are currently in the process of creating a 501(c3) called "A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota, Young Riders Scholarship." This will separate the scholarship program from A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota much like Motorcycle Dial-A-Ride did years ago. This will allow anyone to donate to the program and use it as a tax write-off. A.B.A.T.E. of Minnesota gambling funds will be eligible to be donated to this new 501(c3).

As far as the Share the Road program is concerned, I have received presentation reports from members of Buffalo Ridge Chapter and North Star Chapter. Since the April board meeting, there were presentations given to 61 kids in the Marshall area and 70 kids in the Bemidji area for an overall total of 131. A huge thank you to the members of these two chapters that are educating up-and-coming motor vehicle operators about motorcyclists. Keep educating yourself!

Hello all:

There have been a few things going to keep an eye on. This is one of the articles that I wanted to share with you.

An investigative report by the Wall Street Journal (WSJ) on Tesla crashes caught our eye this week. The report used crash data submitted by Tesla to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and cross-referenced it with state accident reports. All told, WSJ evaluated 222 crashes involving Tesla's.

Of those 222 crashes, 44 occurred when a Tesla, operating in Autopilot, "veered suddenly." An additional 31 happened when the vehicles "failed to stop or yield." Much of the report focuses on Tesla's use of camera technology to identify surroundings on the road. Tesla relies heavily on cameras to support its automated driving system. However, other manufacturers of autonomous vehicles use a combination of

technologies, including cameras, radar, and LiDAR (Light Detection And Ranging).

Beyond the hardware issues, the report also cited slow updates to the algorithm used to support the Autopilot system. While all video footage taken during these crashes is transmitted to Tesla, they often cite protecting their proprietary technology as a reason to keep the footage from the public. In reports to NHTSA, much of the data is redacted from public view. In analyzing some of the 222 crashes in the story, the Wall Street Journal used mechanics and hackers to download videos from crashed Tesla's. This process requires physically removing the main computer from the vehicle, accessing its data, and pairing it with the video images.

The spotlight on Tesla and its Autopilot system is growing hotter. Last summer the Washington Post did their investigation into Tesla crashes. That story, titled: "The Shocking Toll of Tesla's Autopilot," included the infamous quote from former NHTSA Safety official Missy Cummings, "It's very dangerous for motorcycles to be around Tesla's."

The last meeting was on July 18th at Saint Paul College. 12 members were appointed to the task force and those 12 members could vote. The Secretary of State's website reflects this data and has also been updated to include three open spots for new applicants. Curt Quiner, a Tri-County member and a member of the CMA, has applied and is expected to be appointed. You might recognize him as the person that does the blessing of the bikes every year just before the State Rally Memorial Run. Thank you Curt!

The new president of the SCVR will also be applying, so that leaves another spot open for anyone who is interested. If you are interested in applying, I can get you the information. Members also received the May meeting minutes just in time for the July meeting. So, we have voting members and the meetings have records! Progress is occurring.

The recent trend is to have a guest speaker come in and talk at the beginning of the meetings, which can potentially eat up valuable time. We've had a few different law enforcement entities, first responders, legislators, etc. come in and speak. This meeting we did not, so we took the time to discuss a list of subject areas to focus on. The consensus was that we should focus on discussion topics that the task force would like input on at the next meeting and find a guest that can give relevant input to our focal point at that time.

The lion's share of the meeting time was spent discussing the new lane splitting/filtering statute and specifically the public awareness campaign. Ideas were floated around regarding topics to educate the motoring public such as, but not limited to: the safety aspects for the motorcyclists, not only the convenience for the motorcyclists but

also the motorists, and congestion relief through the process of splitting and filtering. Currently we are at ground zero when it comes to the public awareness campaign. You could expect to see some of the lower budget items from this campaign during the fall riding season. The more grandiose parts such as radio and TV spots will most likely ramp up in March 2025.

A quote from the American Motorcyclist Association's (AMA) website was read at the meeting and it rings true. It reads, "Passing legislation to permit lane splitting may be the easiest part of the process. Significant effort would subsequently be required to educate the law enforcement community, officials, and administrators within state departments of transportation and public safety, prosecutors, the judiciary, and the general motoring public on the benefits to those groups and motorcyclists to make lane splitting safe for everyone. Using public service announcements and campaigns, traditional broadcast and print media, social media, and other forms of information sharing could assist in highlighting the safety, congestion reduction, and other benefits of lane splitting."

This is the challenge DPS and the task force has in store for them. I would encourage you all to go on the AMA's website and read their full endorsement of lane splitting practices citing the University of California Berkely's research and the HURT report.

I'm not telling you that you should split lanes of traffic on your motorcycle, but I am encouraging you to educate yourself on the subject as there is a lot of information out there.

Currently there have been 38 motorcyclist fatalities compared to 40 last year at this time. 28% of them were unendorsed or unpermitted riders. 34% were single vehicle crashes. 17 fatalities were wearing a helmet at the time of the crash, 18 were not wearing a helmet, and there were three unknowns.

That's it for this month. Make your own choices and keep your head on a swivel.

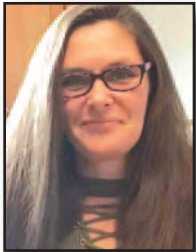

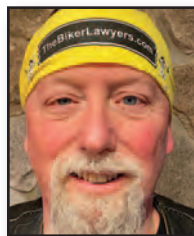
